The doctors say the former Dancing with the Stars contestant has recovered her youthful looks thanks to judicious use of fillers.

60-year-old Aerosmith frontman
checked into Las Encinas Hospital's
chemical dependency clinic in
Pasadena, Calif. It's the same
facility where TV's Dr. Drew Pinsky
practices and is the setting for the
reality series Celebrity Rehab.

Tyler was said to have developed a dependence on painkillers and had reportedly been trying to clean himself up for several months.

Now the singer for the legendary band reveals he went into rehab to find a "safe environment" to recover from several agonizing foot surgeries and physical therapy. The operations were needed to correct longtime foot injuries resulting from his physical performances.

"The doctors told me the pain in my feet could be corrected, but it would require a few surgeries over time," says Tyler,

"The foot repair pain was intense, greater than I'd anticipated. The months of rehabilitative care and the painful strain of physical therapy were traumatic,"
